# PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT

#### Get Your Career on Its Feet.

Working under the supervision of physical therapists, physical therapist assistants help the injured, the elderly and anyone else whose ability to move is impaired. They work in hospitals, home-care agencies, rehabilitation facilities, outpatient clinics and nursing homes.

In the Physical Therapist Assistant program at Carrington College® students are exposed to a combination of classroom study, laboratory practice and hands-on practice through a clinical experience program. They include anatomy, physiology, kinesiology and patient communication. The program, which admits 24 students per cohort, culminates in an Associate of Science degree.<sup>†</sup>

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment of physical therapist assistants and aides is expected to grow 41% from 2012-2022.

#### **Duties May Include:**

- Performing manual muscle testing
- Performing joint range of motion measurements
- Measuring neuromotor function
- Performing orthotic and prosthetic training
- Administering modalities ultrasound, electrical stimulation, iontophoresis, neuromuscular electrical stimulation and transcutaneous electrical stimulation
- Executing therapeutic exercises for strength, balance, flexibility and endurance
- Responding to acute changes in physiologic state, vital signs, sensory response and arousal
- Performing manual therapy techniques: soft tissue mobilization, therapeutic massage, passive range of motion
- · Performing intermittent venous compression techniques
- Administering biofeedback techniques and treatments

- Undergo a physical exam
- Provide proof of Tuberculosis clearance, positive MMR x 2, Varicella or titer, Tetanus Diphtheria, Pertussis (DTAP) and Hepatitis B x 3 vaccinations or signed waiver
- Provide proof of CPR certification (American Heart Association Basic Life Support Health Care Provider)

Applicants meeting all program admission requirements will be selected using points earned from the following

- 1. Entrance examination score
- 2. Work or volunteer-related experience in a health care facility
