In addition, applicants must have had a GPA of 3.0 or above in completion of the listed prerequisites and must be currently licensed as a vocational nurse, show proof of work experience as an LVN within the previous five years, and hold current Health Care Provider CPR certification. Applicants must have a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 3.0 to be admitted to the program. They must also provide an up-to-date immunization record, undergo a physical examination and criminal background/drug screenings, and pass a nursing admission test.
