

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Message From Our President



Carrington College is committed to expanding access to career-focused education that supports local communities and workforce needs. In 2025, the College completed an alignment with its sister school, San Joaquin Valley College (SJVC), strengthening shared best practices while remaining

focused on the regions Carrington College continues to serve. Through hands-on training and strong community partnerships, graduates are prepared for essential roles across healthcare and allied health fields that benefit patients, families, and local economies.

That impact is reflected in both reach and representation. As of January 2026, Carrington College currently serves 7,839 students, many of whom reflect the communities where they will build their careers. As of 2025, the College has awarded more than 171,100 certificates and degrees, helping graduates pursue meaningful careers while supporting workforce stability across seven states.

Workforce preparation remains central to Carrington College's mission, particularly in nursing. From 2022 through 2025, the College trained 2,331 students pursuing a registered nursing career, helping address healthcare workforce shortages and expand access to care.

Community engagement also continues to be a defining part of Carrington College's impact. In 2025, our campuses participated in more than 80 community events and hosted 56 events, creating opportunities for students to apply their learning while giving back through service, outreach, and employer engagement. These experiences reinforce the belief that education extends beyond the classroom and is strongest when connected to real community needs.



Our History

Carrington College was founded in 1967 with the goal of providing practical, hands-on training to help students build meaningful careers. Over the years, Carrington College has grown into a respected, accredited institution offering a wide range of Certificate, Associate, and Bachelor's degree programs in allied health, nursing, dental, and veterinary disciplines. Its focus on clinical excellence and real-world preparation has shaped generations of graduates who continue to serve their communities.

In 2018, Carrington College joined San Joaquin Valley College, Inc. (SJVCi), a family of colleges committed to expanding access to quality, career-focused education. This partnership brought together two mission-driven institutions with shared values and complementary strengths, enhancing opportunities for students and creating new pathways for collaboration across multiple states.

In 2025, Carrington College and San Joaquin Valley College (SJVC) entered a new chapter through a programmatic alignment designed to strengthen each institution's core areas of excellence and better support student success. Through this alignment, Carrington College now focuses exclusively on allied health, nursing, dental, and veterinary programs, areas where it has long excelled.

Measuring Our Impact: *Dental Hygiene*

Under the supervision of a licensed dentist, Dental Hygiene students provide X-rays, teeth cleanings, fluoride treatments, polishings, fillings, and sealants to patients who are often unable to afford these services. Registered dental hygienists instruct and oversee students throughout every patient procedure.

The Irving Wohl Memorial Scholarship supports Dental Hygiene students, honoring a WWII veteran's legacy. This scholarship helped Morgan Brea Elee get started in Carrington College's Dental Hygiene program. Morgan went through a dental assisting program right out of high school, got certification and practiced for a couple of years before staying home with her children. Working as a dental assistant was fulfilling, but she wanted to work with patients at a higher level. Her winning essay was about what Carrington College and our dental clinic provide, helping patients to be more comfortable and not fearful of going to the dentist. Morgan wants to work in a dentist office that allows her to serve the community the way that is needed and appreciated.

Measuring Our Impact: *Respiratory Therapy*

The Respiratory Therapy program at Carrington College requires students to complete over 500 hours of clinical practice. The program allows students to support their local hospitals while providing the skills that prepare them to take the National Board for Respiratory Care (NBRC) Credential Exams.

Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Therapy

As part of the programmatic alignment, the online Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Therapy (BSRT) program transitioned to Carrington College,

expanding advanced respiratory care education under a unified academic framework. This transition reflects a shared commitment to strengthening healthcare pathways by ensuring access to programs that serve critical workforce needs.

The BSRT program at Carrington College expands career advancement opportunities for working registered respiratory therapists and strengthens the healthcare workforce in the communities they serve. Designed as an online bridge program, the BSRT provides a clear pathway for respiratory therapists to progress from an associate degree to a bachelor's degree in as few as 16 months, supporting long-term professional growth and leadership development within the field.

By offering this pathway, Carrington College helps experienced respiratory therapists advance into higher-level roles in leadership and critical care positions that are essential to healthcare system stability and patient care delivery. The program also helps support workforce retention by allowing professionals to continue working while advancing their education, ensuring communities benefit from skilled clinicians who are prepared to take on expanded responsibilities and contribute to improved care outcomes across a wide range of clinical settings.





MEETING OREGON'S NURSING WORKFORCE NEEDS

In 2025, Carrington College expanded access to nursing education in Oregon with the launch of the **Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) program** at its Portland campus, responding directly to critical regional workforce needs. According to Oregon's 2025 Health Care Workforce Needs Assessment, the Portland metro area requires an estimated 500 additional nursing graduates each year to meet growing demand (Oregon Health Authority; Oregon Public Broadcasting).

Designed to prepare students for licensure as Registered Nurses, the ADN program combines hands-on lab training, evidence-based coursework, and clinical preparation to support local hospitals, clinics, and care facilities. By educating nurses within the communities they will serve, the program strengthens the healthcare workforce while improving access to safe, compassionate care for individuals and families across the Portland region.




PDS Health Helps Enhance Dental Assisting Programs

Carrington College works closely with local and national employers to ensure its academic programs align with workforce needs and prepare graduates for successful careers. These partnerships help strengthen local economies while providing students with relevant, hands-on training informed by industry expectations. Employers also play an active role in supporting Carrington College programs through hiring, engagement, and direct investment in student success.

In 2025, PDS Health—a long-standing employer partner that hires Carrington College graduates—demonstrated its commitment to workforce development through a \$10,000 contribution in support of the College's Dental Assisting programs. The contribution funded new intraoral cameras, enhancing students' hands-on learning experience and allowing them to train with the same technology used in modern dental practices. This investment helps ensure graduates are well prepared to enter the workforce with practical, job-ready skills.



Named after Dr. Carolyn Ghazal and her heart for service, the scholarship is a partnership between PDS Health and dental schools to mold the next generation of dental assistants with a passion for service and track record of teamwork and leadership.



Beyond financial support, PDS Health maintains an active presence on Carrington College campuses by engaging directly with students, faculty, and staff. These connections strengthen the bridge between education and employment, reinforcing Carrington College's commitment to training professionals who are ready to serve patients and communities upon graduation. Growing Programs for Tomorrow's Workforce

Diagnostic Medical Sonography in Temecula

In 2025, Carrington College continued to expand its academic portfolio to meet critical workforce needs in the communities it serves. One example is the launch of the Diagnostic Medical Sonography (DMS) program, designed to help address growing demand for skilled imaging professionals in the healthcare field. By introducing new programs, Carrington College is helping students access meaningful career opportunities while supporting local healthcare systems.

The DMS program prepares students for entry-level careers as diagnostic medical sonographers through a combination of classroom instruction, hands-on laboratory training, and supervised clinical externships. Students receive education in anatomy and physiology, patient care, medical terminology, and specialized sonographic applications such as obstetrics, vascular studies, and abdominal imaging. This comprehensive approach ensures graduates are equipped with both technical skills and the professionalism required in real-world healthcare settings.
